HEAD OF SCHOOL MESSAGE Cultivate and Inspire MR. JOEL SLOFSTRA

The Core Purpose of WRCA is to inspire and cultivate citizens of Godly character who transform their world for Christ. There are a couple words in this statement that I want to unwrap.



The first word is **CULTIVATE**. As a teenager, I worked on dairy farms and had a lot of exposure to farming equipment like tractors and a variety of farm implements. One such farm implement is a cultivator. This implement is made up of teeth and spikes whose job it is to disrupt the soil and give plants the ability to grow. A cultivator helps with soil preparation by breaking it up and loosening the soil to make it easier for the plants' roots to grow. Our school does this for our students by laying down a foundation for our students. This includes our core programs of academics, arts, athletics and service. We are educating the whole child.

A cultivator also helps with weed control by removing weeds that compete with crops for nutrients, water and sunlight. As a school, we do this through teaching discernment to our students and teaching them how, as believers, to be a part of this world as opposed to apart from this world. Lastly, a cultivator mixes the soil. This allows good stuff, like fertilizer, to get mixed into the soil promoting plant growth.

Our goal with cultivating our students is to give them the foundation so they will have the ability to transform their world for Christ.

Having ability is not enough. We want our students to also have the desire to do this work. The second word from our Core Purpose I want to highlight is **INSPIRE**. One way we do this is by tying learning back to Christ. Our teachers add Christian perspective into learning. Our students wrestle with what they are learning in the context that our Creator has His hands in all things. Another way we do this is through an emphasis on character and service. This is done through Bible classes, chapels and spiritual retreats, service opportunities in our communities and beyond, and transformational learning opportunities where students are stretched in their thinking and being.


We also inspire through role models. Our staff model what it looks like to live out a Christcentered life. They encourage students to deepen their relationship with Christ and to seek His will in their lives.





BY THE NUMBERS

Financial Update

The 2024 financial summary for White Rock Christian Academy (WRCA) includes the following key highlights:

Revenue and Expenses:

- WRCA generated a total revenue of approximately \$12.97 million, up from \$11.89 million in 2023. Major sources included tuition fees (\$6.04 million), government educational grants (\$3.06 million), and donation revenue of \$635,884.
- Total expenses for the year were approximately \$13.28 million, an increase from \$12.76 million in 2023. The largest expense categories were salaries and benefits (\$7.57 million) and other operating expenses which includes amortization of capital assets (\$2.1 million).

Deficiency of Revenue Over Expenses:

• WRCA reported a net operating deficit of \$309,840, improved from the prior year's deficit of \$878,109.

Capital Assets and Debt:

 Capital assets totaled \$23.93 million as of June 30, 2024, with investments in new facilities and the sports field and amphitheater. These projects are financed partly by debt, with loans totaling approximately \$18.6 million. The total net repayment of debt due within one year was \$1,032,300 with interest paid of \$648,333.

Development and Fundraising:


 Last year the Development department raised \$635,884 from our generous WRCA community through private donors and fundraising initiatives, including the Annual Drive, Gala, Reserved Parking, Corporate Partnerships, and the Warrior Classic Golf Tournament.


This information underscores WRCA's ongoing financial stability while facing the challenge of covering operating deficits and managing debt for campus improvements.




Financial Update REVENUE






EXPENSES




