HEAD OF SCHOOL MESSAGE Blessed to Be a Blessing: Sharing God's Work at WRCA MR. JOEL SLOFSTRA



Since Christmas, White Rock Christian Academy has had the privilege of welcoming several visiting groups, giving us the opportunity to showcase the incredible work God is doing in and through our school. These visits have given us the opportunity to strengthen existing partnerships and also to share the gifts God has entrusted to us.

Among our recent visitors were representatives from Kuwasha, as we prepare for our upcoming TLO mission trip, and a delegation from Chukyo High School, deepening our international connections with our Japanese Student Program (JSP) friends. Additionally, we were honored to host a group of professionals who spoke to our students at our Career Fair, helping them imagine possibilities for their futures.

One of the impactful visits was from a Christian IB candidate school in Korea, whose leadership team came to learn more about implementing the IB framework through a biblical lens. It was a joy to share our journey, insights, and challenges with them as they work to integrate faith and academic excellence in their own unique context. At a recent conference, I met with leaders from Christian IB schools whom WRCA had previously assisted in navigating the IB authorization process. Reflecting on how God has used our experiences to bless and equip other Christian IB schools was truly humbling.





In January, we also had the honor of hosting 50 education students from Trinity Western University, as they prepared to enter their teaching practicums. These future educators came to WRCA to gain insight into our distinct approach to Christian education and to see firsthand how faith is intentionally woven into our teaching and school. Our hope is that they left inspired and equipped to carry their faith boldly into their classrooms, wherever God calls them to serve.

Part of our Core Purpose is that our students will transform their world for Christ. We are committed to that as a school as well. This means nurturing and educating the students entrusted to us and also blessing others by sharing how God has blessed us. What is your best memory of WRCA?

My best memory as a student at WRCA is winning the Provincial Volleyball Championship in our home gym. It was an amazing experience to have the entire school community involved in helping to host other schools, cheering us on and sharing in our success. And meeting my husband.;)

After WRCA, what education did you go onto and your career choice so far?

After graduating, I completed my Bachelor of Education. I spent the first part of my career as a classroom teacher and Head of Elementary School. I then chose to help my husband with his dream of creating a non-profit where 100% of donations go directly to the end cause. We build and operate schools in developing countries, supporting students and communities with little to no access to education. I worked as a teacher-on-call and short-term contract teacher for a few years when my girls were in elementary school. Most recently, I completed my Orton-Gillingham Practitioner (OGP) certification and have worked in supporting students with English language based learning challenges.

Why did you come back to WRCA and what is the biggest difference you have seen so far?

Our family initially came back to WRCA after adopting our oldest daughter. We needed a safe place for her to begin her schooling in Canada and WRCA welcomed and supported her. Our younger two daughters came to WRCA when they entered Grade 8. We wanted them to be in a community with teachers and friends who would encourage them in their faith and support them in pursuing excellence in all areas of life. The community is much larger than when I attended as a high school student, but it still feels like an extended family. It is amazing to see how a school can grow and change but stay true to its core values of Christian education, helping students grow and serve with purpose.

Through these experiences, we invite God to transform us spiritually, allowing that transformation to impact both our own communities and the ones we visit. The goal is that students will reflect on how these TLOs (Transformational Learning Opportunities) shape their hearts, faith, and futures.

- **Local Service:** Students partnered with local organizations for hands-on service. This year, the service week was March 10-14. These organizations included, but are not limited to:
 - Local churches including White Rock Community Church and Evergreen Baptist
 - Community services including Salvation Army White Rock and Night Shift
 - Kitchens such as Cloverdale Community Kitchen and Langley Food Bank
 - o Animal care facilities such as Urban Safari and Argos Pet Ranch
- **Kuwasha in Uganda:** From March 8-18, a number of G11-12 students joined Kuwasha's efforts in southern Uganda, igniting change through education, healthcare, and community development in a region deeply impacted by past conflicts and poverty.
- YWAM in Mazatlán, Mexico: Also on March 8-18, a number of G10-12 students engaged in community service projects with Youth With a Mission (YWAM), meeting local needs while sharing the love of Christ. This trip also highlights YWAM's gap year programs, offering students a path for further personal and spiritual growth after graduation.

We deeply appreciated the community's unwavering support and prayers of these service opportunities. Whether entrusting us with your children or offering financial and practical assistance, your generosity makes these experiences possible. Thanks to you, our students engaged with new cultures, contributed to meaningful projects, and grew in ways that will last a lifetime. A Beloved Student Returns A LETTER FROM TOSHI

February 27, 2025

Dear WRCA Community,

As most of you know, last February (2024) I was diagnosed with an aggressive type of leukaemia, known as AML or Acute Myeloid Leukaemia.

I had to quit school immediately and for the next 5 and a half months, I stayed in the BC Children's Hospital. There, I underwent intensive chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant. While it all seemed very crazy and surreal, and there were many uncomfortable moments, I have felt God's peace and strength throughout the whole experience.

While the bone marrow transplant was a success, I continued to go for checkups three times a week to make sure my new bone marrow was not attacking my body. Currently, I only have to go to the hospital twice a month because everything is going well. In September, I started doing school from home until the doctors felt that it was safe for me to gradually go back to school after winter break. Even though right now it is only part time, and I do not have all my energy back yet, it feels really good to be back at school with my friends. I am starting to feel more and more like my old self again.

I am so thankful for everyone who prayed for me. The encouraging notes, cards and amazing support gave me strength, especially during the really tough times. I am also very thankful for my teachers' patience and understanding, and all my friends who showed me their care and kindness.


I had my biopsy 2 weeks ago and the results show that there are no signs of disease. I am very grateful that our God has completely healed me.






